Responsibilities: To spend one hour or more in silent Adoration with Jesus and to ensure that He is not alone. (The church must never be empty when the Blessed Sacrament is exposed.)

Commitment: The Blessed Sacrament is exposed on Thursdays from 8:00 a.m. to 6:45 p.m. All are welcome to come any time of the day and stay for any length of time. Parishioners are encouraged to sign up for a specific hour of adoration in order to ensure that there is always someone present.

Commitment: The ministry is open to all over the age of eighteen who have a special love and reverence for the Blessed Sacrament. Special training is required and ministers are expected to be present prior to the beginning of their scheduled Mass.

Helpful Attributes: Enjoy public speaking. Have a willingness to take time to prepare to meet responsibilities. Must be a practicing, confirmed Catholic.

Commitment: Approximately one Sunday per month, plus preparation time, plus some initial training. Periodic meetings are announced.

Responsibilities: The Rosary is recited aloud after daily Mass and different people take turns reciting each decade. Must be able to pray with an audible voice.

Commitment: Approx. 15-20 min. after daily Mass at church. Meetings announced when needed.

Faith Formation

Adult Confirmation

Goals & Purpose: To prepare adult (18+) baptized Catholics who have already celebrated First Communion, but are in need of Confirmation.

Responsibilities: Participation in a five-week series of classes, as well as home preparation and participation in the sacraments.

Helpful Attributes: Desire to learn more and live the Catholic Faith before and after Confirmation.

Commitment: Meet for five weeks on Sunday after 9:15 a.m. Mass, from 10:30 - 11:45 a.m. Sessions are in fall (Nov/Dec) and spring (Apr/May). Please see bulletin for more details.

Baptism Preparation Team

Goals & Purpose: To prepare parents for infant baptism and to assist during Mass.

Responsibilities: The team leads a two-hour class for parents. Members of the team assist during baptism Masses.

Helpful Attributes: Welcoming personality; ability to work with other ministries.

Commitment: Classes are held six times per year – first Tuesday of alternating months from 7:00 - 9:00 p.m. Team members should be present 30 minutes prior to Mass to help set up for the scheduled baptisms. Training is required.

Responsibilities: To serve as adult table mentors for the one-year Confirmation process, which meets once a month for five months.

First Penance/First Eucharist Team

Goals & Purpose: To prepare our young people for their first celebration of the Sacraments of Penance and Eucharist.

Responsibilities: Be involved in one of the following capacities: regular weekly catechist or aides in the Sunday or Monday programs; interview for First Penance and First Communion; function as a member of the retreat team for First Penance and First Communion; help with practices for First Communion.

Helpful Attributes: Love for the Catholic Faith and enthusiastic willingness to work with young people; be a practicing Catholic who has celebrated the sacraments of initiation and, if married, is married according to the laws of the Church.

Commitment: Based on individual roles, time commitment can be weekly for one hour, three hours for interviews, two hours for retreats, and two hours for First Communion practices. Meetings are conducted weekly for sacrament classes, twice a year for interviews, and once a year for practices. Training is required and provided.

Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA)

Goals & Purpose: To prepare adults who are interested in becoming Catholic, as well as for those baptized Catholics who are in need of First Communion and Confirmation.

Responsibilities: SPONSORS: Weekly participation in class and mentoring of candidates outside of class. TEAM: Weekly preparation of class and planning.

Helpful Attributes: Love for the Catholic Faith and enthusiastic willingness to work with others; friendliness. Sponsors should be practicing Catholics who have celebrated the sacraments of initiation and, if married, married according to the laws of the Church.

Commitment: An hour and a half each week for the duration of the classes. Training is required and provided.

Sacramental Catechesis for Older Students

Goals & Purpose: To prepare our young people (fourth grade - high school) for their first celebration of the Sacraments of Penance and Eucharist.

Responsibilities: Be involved in one of the following capacities: regular weekly catechist or aide in the Sunday program; interview for First Penance and First Communion; function as a member of the retreat team for First Penance and First Communion; help with practices for First Communion.

Helpful Attributes: Love for the Catholic Faith and enthusiastic willingness to work with young people; be a practicing Catholic who has celebrated the sacraments of initiation and, if married, is married according to the laws of the Church.

Commitment: Based on individual roles, time commitment can be weekly for one hour, three-hour commitment for interviews, a two-hour commitment for retreats, and two hours for First Communion practices. Meetings are conducted weekly for sacrament classes, twice a year for interviews, and once a year for First Communion practices. Training is required and provided.

Catechist/Aide/Helper

Goals & Purpose: To teach the Catholic Faith to our young people participating in religious education classes (K - 8th grade).

Responsibilities:

Catechist: Main instructor who has engaged in the necessary lesson planning to provide a weekly instruction that is informative and also interactive, based on the appropriate learning styles and methods.

Aide (Aged 18+): To assist the catechist in the appropriate learning styles and methods.

Helper (Teen): To assist the catechist and aide in practical matters similar to that of an aide.

Helpful Attributes: Love for the Catholic Faith and enthusiastic willingness to work with young people; patience; friendliness; good organization skills, excellent communication skills, especially with parents; if Catechist, a practicing Catholic who has celebrated the sacraments of initiation and married according to the laws of the Church.

Commitment: Participate in the weekly classes (one and a half hours each) throughout the school year. Specialized training is required and provided.

Substitute Catechist

Goals & Purpose: To substitute for catechists, as necessary.

Responsibilities: In consultation with the catechist, implementation of class activities based on a predetermined lesson plan; notification of catechist after class as to the success of the lesson.

Helpful Attributes: Love for the Catholic Faith and enthusiastic willingness to work with young people; patience; friendliness; good organization skills, excellent communication skills, especially with parents; if Catechist, a practicing Catholic who has celebrated the sacraments of initiation and married according to the laws of the Church.

Commitment: Participate in the weekly classes (one and a half hours each) throughout the school year, as needed and requested by the catechist. Specialized training is required and provided.

(Children are either mainstreamed into regular classroom with an appropriate aide, or participate in a self-enclosed class where there is more specialized instruction.)

Helpful Attributes: Love for Catholic Faith and enthusiastic willingness to work with young people; patience; friendliness; good organization skills, excellent communication skills, especially with parents; practicing Catholic who has celebrated the sacraments of initiation and is married according to the laws of the Church.

Commitment: Participate in the weekly student classes throughout the school year. Specialized training is required and is provided.
